1. Review of minutes: May

Bonnie Hunt, Modesto College, moved to approve the minutes.

Russell Reid, Feather River, seconded the motion.

The minutes were approved with minor formatting corrections.

2. ASCCC Update (Cheryl Aschenbach)

Cheryl Aschenbach reported ASCCC continues to advocate for AB 927. Additionally, they are aware of the need to update the baccalaureate degree handbook, it is on their to do list.

Mike Slavich reminded the group if AB 927 passes, the colleges will be eager to implement new degrees; specifically he stated "it's going to be a fire drill for implementation."

Cheryl said the BDP is poised to lead the colleges for expansion. The ASCCC and CCCCO collaboration on the development of competency based education (CBE) was modeled after the structure of the BDP.

Mike Slavich reported he has received the resumes and all of the necessary paperwork for the

consultants. CCCCO funding for the research consultants is on the agenda for the Rio Hondo Board of Trustees July meeting. One the agreement is approved, Mike will send copies of MOU to all parties for approval. The funding will be available July 8, 2021- through next year. Resumes and all of the paperwork.

8. Latin Honors Criteria for BDP (Dawn McKenna)

Dawn McKenna, Santa Ana College, reported the issue regarding Latin honors came up because students asked about it. Students asked about it because they were interested in graduating with honors and joining the honors society.

Mike Slavich said Rio Hondo looked into Latin honors, but the Evaluators were not ready to implement it.

There was agreement from the group Latin honors should appear on the transcript. There was a recommendation to add it to the handbook. This would be helpful for colleges trying to implement it.

The discussion continued regarding the different models available; i.e., set GPA criteria or percentage of graduates. There was preference for a set GPA criteria.

The following examples were presented:

CSU LB: The following grade-point average (GPA) criteria are used to identify undergraduate students eligible for the honors specified:

- Summa Cum Laude: GPA equal to or greater than 3.950,
- Magna Cum Laude: GPA equal to or greater than 3.750 but less than 3.950, and
- Cum Laude: GPA equal to or greater than 3.500 but less than 3.750.

CSU SB:

Summa Cum Laude: an overall cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 3.9 or above and a grade point average of 3.9 or above in all work attempted at this university. These students are entitled to wear gold and maroon cords.

Magna Cum Laude: an overall cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 3.75 or above and a grade point average of 3.75 or above in all work attempted at this university. These students are entitled to wear a gold cord.

Cum Laude: an overall cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 3.5 or above and a grade point average of 3.5 or above in all work attempted at this university. These students are entitled to wear a maroon cord.

9. Building the Pipeline (Estella Narrie)

Estella Narrie, Santa Monica College, reported the Articulation Officers held a meeting in May. They discussed the flexibility colleges were allowed with CSU GE and how much flexibility is allowed. It was determined some colleges are allowing flexibility and some are not offering any flexibility.

10. Legislative Update (Tina Recalde)

Tina Recalde reported AB 927 passed to the appropriations committee, passed the Assembly on June 1, and we are waiting to hear from the Senate. She reminded member to send letters of support to Margaret Lamb and Constance Carroll.

California State University Samples

CSU Channel Island

University Honors

To receive honors at graduation at CSU Channel Islands, a student must:

- 1. Complete a minimum 30 units of courses taken at CI for a letter grade.;
- 2. Earn a grade point average of 3.50 or above in all work taken at Cl.
- 3. Earn the following cumulative grade point average in all undergraduate courses, including transfer work:
 - o Summa Cum Laude
 - This honor is awarded to all students who earn a grade point average of 3.90 4.0.
 - o Magna Cum Laude
 - This honor is awarded to all students who earn a grade point average of 3.75 3.89
 - o Cum Laude
 - This honor is awarded to all students who earn a grade point average of 3.50 3.74. (SP03-24)

Humboldt State

Honors for Undergraduates

Humboldt State University awards honors to undergraduate students at the time of graduation, based on the following criteria:

- Completion of 30 units in letter-graded course work in residence at Humboldt State University
- A minimum GPA of 3.50 on all work taken at Humboldt State University
- Overall minimum GPA of 3.50 on all work attempted

The overall grade point average (including both transfer and Humboldt State University course work) determines which honors the student receives at graduation:

- Summa Cum Luade (highest honors) 3.85 to 4.00
- Magna Cum Laude (high honors) 3.70 to 3.84
- Cum Laude (honors) 3.50 to 3.69

Chico State

Varies by department

These are determined by the Dean of the College of Communication and Education. The College of Communication and education graduates students in the following areas: Communication Studies, Communication Sciences and Disorders, Journalism and Public Relations, Media Arts & Technology, Kinesiology and Exercise Physiology, Liberal Studies and Recreation, Hospitality and Parks Management. Recipients of this award receive a medallion to wear at graduation and are awarded in the classroom among their peers.

Summa Cum Laude – Top 1% of graduating students in the College of Communication and Education.

Magna Cum Laude - Top 3% of graduating seniors in the College of Communication and Education

Cum Laude – Top 5% of graduating seniors in the College of Communication and Education

Sonoma State

To qualify for Honors, your SSU AND Overall GPA's must meet the minimum of 3.50 and you must have completed at least 45 letter-graded units in residence at SSU.

Honors will be noted on the official transcript and on your diploma. Both your final SSU AND your Overall GPA's must be at least:

- 3.50 for Cum Laude
- 3.75 for Magna Cum Laude
- 3.90 for Summa Cum Laude

For the purpose of the Commencement Book, we will use the units and GPA from your last graded semester. Actual honors will be recalculated at the end of the Spring semester and will appear on your transcript and diploma.

Cal State East Bay

Graduation with Honors

Candidates for the baccalaureate degree may be eligible for the awarding of Latin Honors at the time of graduation if they have fulfilled the following conditions:

- 1. They must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.65 or higher in all coursework and in coursework completed at Cal State East Bay.
- 2. They must have completed at least 40 semester-units of coursework in residence (as defined in the University Catalog) at Cal State East Bay.

summa cum laude (cumulative GPA, overall and at CSUEB, of 3.85-4.00) highest honor

magna cum laude (cumulative GPA, overall and at CSUEB, of 3.75-3.84) high honor

cum laude (cumulative GPA, overall and at CSUEB, of 3.65-3.74) honor

The GPA is officially calculated at the time the student has completed graduation requirements. The honors designation will be noted on the student's diploma and official transcript. The conditions noted above apply equally to second-baccalaureate degree candidates.

San Jose State University

Latin Honors

To qualify for Latin Honors, both your Cumulative SJSU GPA and your All College GPA must meet the minimum requirements. Your department may have additional honors for your major. If you qualify, we will automatically apply the appropriate honor(s) to both your diploma and transcript. If you have questions about medallions, contact the Commencement Team.

Academic Honors

Students graduating with Academic Honors will be recognized at the Commencement Ceremony. Awarded to students achieving an overall grade-point average of 3.5 and higher, Academic Honors are based on completion of at least three semesters in residence at CSUMB. Second Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree candidates are not eligible for Academic Honors.

To find out if you are receiving Academic Honors go to My CSUMB and under the Student Services and Financial Aid menu, go to Student Record Information, then click on view academic transcript. Next, click on display transcript and scroll down to Transcript Totals. If your overall GPA is 3.5 or higher and you meet the criteria above (as of Fall 2020), you are graduating with honors at commencement.


Fresno State University

Honors at the time of graduation from the university are awarded to undergraduate students based on the following criteria.

- 1. Student must have an overall minimum grade point average of 3.5 on all work attempted.
- 2. Student must have a minimum grade point average of 3.5 on all work taken at the university.
- 3. Student must have completed 45 units in residence at California State University, Fresno.

The grade point average earned at California State University, Fresno determines which honors the student receives:

Color of cord (Red, Blue, Gold)
Color of cord (Red, Blue, Silver)
Color of cord (Red, Blue)

Magna Cum Laude (high honors) 3.70 to 3.89

Cal State Bakersfield

Graduate with Honors

Honors at graduation are awarded to undergraduate students who have completed at least 40 residential units of letter grade work as part of their baccalaureate program. Honors awards take into account all courses taken at California State University, Bakersfield and other institutions of higher learning. The grade point averages (GPA) necessary for graduation with honors are as follows:

- summa cum laude
 3.9 to 4.0 GPA
- magna cum laude
 3.6 to 3.89 GPA
- cum laude 3.3 to 3.59 GPA

CSU Northridge

- 1. Complete a minimum of 30 units of work in letter-graded courses at CSUN.
- 2. Earn a GPA of 3.50 or above in all work taken at CSUN.
- 3. Earn a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or above in all units attempted, including transfer units.

The following are the categories of honors at graduation:

Summa Cum Laude Cumulative GPA of 3.90 or above

Magna Cum Laude Cumulative GPA of 3.75 to 3.89

Cum Laude Cumulative GPA of 3.50 to 3.74

CSU San Bernardino

University Honors

To be considered for University Honors for graduation, an undergraduate student must have completed a minimum of 45 units of work at California State University, San Bernardino in courses for which letter grades (A, B, C and D) were received. University Honors for commencement are based on the student's units and grade point average through the end of the semester prior to commencement.

- Summa Cum Laude: an overall cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 3.9 or above and a grade point average of 3.9 or above in all work attempted at this university. These students are entitled to wear gold and maroon cords.
- Magna Cum Laude: an overall cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 3.75 or above and a grade point average of 3.75 or above in all work attempted at this university. These students are entitled to wear a gold cord.
- Cum Laude: an overall cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 3.5 or above and a grade point average of 3.5 or above in all work attempted at this university. These students are entitled to wear a maroon cord.

Undergraduate candidates receiving University Honors for degrees are listed in the Commencement Program. Honors are based on the students units and grade point average through the end of the semester prior to commencement.

Honor Cord: Undergraduate students who have earned University Honors are eligible to wear an honor cord as a special mark of the distinction achieved. Qualified undergraduate students will be sent an email. You must present your letter at the Coyote Bookstore in order to purchase your honor cord. Graduate students do not wear honor cords.

Cal State Los Angeles

Cal State L.A. uses three designations of honors at graduation: Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude and Summa Cum Laude. Effective Fall 2016, to be eligible for honors, an undergraduate student must have completed a minimum of 45 units in residence at Cal State L.A. and have attained the appropriate standing (in terms of cumulative grade point average earned at Cal State L.A.) as described below:

- Summa Cum Laude: GPA equal to or greater than 3.9
- Magna Cum Laude: GPA equal to or greater than 3.75 but less than 3.9
- Cum Laude: GPA equal to or greater than 3.5 but less than 3.75

CSU San Marcos

- Academic honors recognition is based on undergraduate coursework completed the fall term before Commencement.
- Grades recorded through the fall semester will be calculated for the overall GPA and the institutional GPA.
- The lower of these two GPA's will be used to determine academic honor recognition in the commencement printed program and name cards.

Cum laude

at least 3.5, but less than 3.7

Magna cum laude

at least 3.7, but less than 3.9

Summa cum laude

at least 3.9

SDSU

Graduation With Honors and Distinction Graduation with honors is granted to undergraduate students who achieve high grade point averages. Excellence is recognized at three levels:

- cum laude (3.50-3.64)
- magna cum laude (3.65-3.79)
- summa cum laude (3.80-4.00)

University of California

UC Berkeley

Honors in the Major

Some majors offer departmental honors. Students may enroll in their major's honors program provided they earn the major's required GPA standards and the approval of the major department. Students participating in the honors program in their major may enroll in fewer than 13 units in order to work on a thesis. Honors in the major is noted on the transcript and diploma. Visit your Undergraduate Major Adviser (UMA) for more information.

Honors to Date

An Honors to Date notation on the transcript indicates completion of at least 12 letter-graded units and a cumulative GPA equivalent to that required for Distinction in General Scholarship.

L&S did not award honors-to-date in Spring 2020.

Dean's Honors List

The Dean's Honors List recognizes outstanding academic achievement each fall and spring semester. To earn Dean's Honors for a semester, the criteria are:

- 13 or more letter-graded units in that semester
- Semester GPA in the top 10% of L&S undergraduates
- No disqualifying grades that semester (I, NR, or NP grades or courses for which no grades have been submitted).

Beginning Spring 2013, after each term, "Dean's honors" is noted on the student's transcript automatically by the Registrar for students who meet the above criteria.

UC Davis

Dean's Honors List

According to UC Davis campus regulations the quarterly Dean's Honors List includes names of students who have completed, for a letter grade, a minimum of 12 units in a specific quarter with a grade point average equal to or higher than the minimum grade point average attained by the upper-16 percent of those registered in the same class level and college during that quarter. The grade point average required is calculated at the end of every quarter. Students on the Dean's Honor List for the College of Letters and Science can download a copy of their Honors Letter from the Online Advising Student Information System (OASIS).

Honors at Graduation

Graduation with "honors" requires that a student meet the appropriate grade point requirement based on the number of UC units completed upon graduation. Grade point averages from the winter quarter prior to graduation are used to determine the averages that will earn an honors designation. Current grade point average for the College of Letters & Science are shown below.

UC Irvine

The campus policy specifies that no more than 16 percent of graduating seniors will receive academic honors: approximately 2 percent summa cum laude, 4 percent magna cum laude, and 10 percent cum laude. Students must have completed at least 72 quarter units in residence at a University of California campus. Students who have on file recorded incidents of academic dishonesty are not eligible for Honors at Graduation.

In addition to this campus criteria, the School of Education uses cumulative GPA as the criterion for the awarding of Honors at Graduation.

UCLA

Latin Honors

The College and schools award Latin honors according to overall grade-point average (GPA) at graduation. Honors are reflected on official transcripts and diplomas. Eligible students must have completed at least 90 (98 for the School of Nursing) University of California units for a letter grade. The levels of honors are summa cum laude, magna cum laude, and cum laude. Latin honors are noted on official transcripts and diplomas.

Requirements are subject to yearly change and other eligibility restrictions. Contact the College or school for information.

UC Merced

Honors at Graduation

Senate Regulation: Part II, Section 4. A.

To be eligible for honors at graduation, a student must have completed a minimum of 50 semester units at the University of California, of which a minimum of 43 units must have been taken for a letter grade and a minimum of 30 units must have been completed at UC Merced. The grade point average achieved must rank in the top 2 percent of the student's School for highest honors, the next 4 percent for high honors, and the next 10 percent for honors at graduation. The number of recipients eligible under these percentages shall be rounded up to the next higher integer.

UC Riverside

Standard for the Award of Honors at Graduation

As passed by the Academic Senate (June 1977), these categories were based on the Spring 2019 graduating class--the highest 2% receiving Highest Honors, the next 4% receiving High Honors, and the next 10% receiving Honors.

The grade point averages which mark the cutoff points for each honors category for the June graduating class shall be used as minimum criteria for the award of the same categories of honors to students in the Summer, Fall, and Winter graduating classes which follow.

Please remember that recognition of honors at the Commencement Exercises for spring and summer graduation candidates are based on unverified data. The official determination (for transcript and diploma purposes) will be based upon the calculated grade point averages of the actual spring graduates.

Honors at graduation for students graduating Spring 2020 through Winter 2021 will be based on the following grade point average cutoffs. Only those students who have passed 60 or more UC units with letter grades will be considered.

Learn how Latin Honors (Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, and Summa Cum Laude) are calculated and added to graduating seniors' diplomas.

Each year, the top 14 percent of the graduating seniors on campus are eligible for honors. The honors are organized into three levels:

- Cum Laude
- Magna Cum Laude
- Summa Cum Laude

The ranking of students for eligibility for college honors is based on their cumulative <u>grade point</u> <u>average</u>. To be eligible for honors, you must receive letter grades for at least 72 quarter-units of course work at the University of California.

Generally, no more than the top 2 percent are eligible for Summa Cum Laude, and no more than the next 4 percent for Magna Cum Laude. The remaining 8 percent are eligible for Cum Laude.

Class Ranking: The University of California does not rank students at graduation.

The grade-point average thresholds for the honors categories listed below are calculated based on the population of graduates from the preceding academic year. Grade-point averages are not rounded. A minimum of 76.0 letter-graded UC units must be completed in order to be eligible for honors. *Effective with graduates Fall 2018 and later, a minimum of 60.0 letter-graded UC units must be completed in order to be eligible for honors.*
