

Steering Committee Meeting Notes

1. Review of minutes: February

Anthony Cordova, Bakersfield College, moved to approve the motion Beatrice, Skyline College seconded the motion

2. ASCCC Update (Cheryl Aschenbach)

Cheryl Aschenbach shared highlights from the ASCCC legislative visit. Atotal of six teams canvassed the capital all virtually meeting with a number of legislators and their staff really talking about three primary things:

- Encouraging them to continue to support resource requests that are geared towards an equitable access.
- technology, not just for students, especially for students, but also for faculty and staff and ensuring that we have we're possible that we have system support so that we can all have access to the same technologies, especially as we finish with some of the pandemics; and
- Promoted the work being done with pen education resources initiative (OERI) grants. The grant team has done an incredible job pulling folks together across disciplines to develop and identify areas where there's need for more resources.

<u>Click</u> to access OERI documents, some of the subjects I think are related to our baccalaureate programs and so they'll continue doing that work.

Cheryl also shared the Senate has its plenary coming up April 7-9. The topic is strengthening teaching leading and learning through racial justice and academic freedom. They recognize the need to continue our work around racial justice and also recognize that there are ongoing threats probably more so nationally, but, including California to academic freedom and so will, this will be our central discussions during our three day conference.

3. CCBAConference Reports

Jim DeKloe (Solano College) shared he and Mke Fino (MiraCostaCollege) gave a presentation on biomanufacturing completing the pathway from high school through graduate school, Ph.D. There were 18 participants. Additionally MiraCosta gave a student success completion presentation; student speaker Esther Nair won 5 scholarships. Bonnie Hunt (Modesto Junior College) said it was great presentation. The MiraCosta student shared the importance of the programs, she just bought a house and how the program helped another student who was homeless and had substance abuse, the program turn her life around.

Arizona new legislation for degree

Carmen Dones (West LA), was invited to participate on an advisory board promising practices from the current programs in place, surveys, Debra Bragg,

Dr. Francisco C. Rodriguez, Chancellor, Los Angeles Community College District, was one of the keynote speakers. He discussed the importance and success of the California Community College's baccalaureate degrees including their ability to increase access to bachelor's degrees among California's students.
