

Steering Committee Meeting Notes

April 20, 2022 10:15 a.m. 11:15 a.m.

1. Review of minutes: March

Jeff Gordon, Santa Monica College, moved to approve the motion.

Anthony Cordova, Bakersfield College, seconded the motion.

2. ASCCC Update (Cheryl Aschenbach)

Cheryl Aschenbach shared during Spring 2022 Plenary, ASCCC resolved that the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges work with the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office to develop a lower division general education pathway specific to California community college baccalaureate degree programs for approval by Spring 2023 and system-wide implementation by fall 2024. Additionally, Aschenbach reported ASCCC is continuing to talk with legislators about AB 928. The ICAS committee is scheduled to review the proposed single general education pattern required by 928 the following week.

Other updates included: Viriginia (Ginni) May was elected as ASCCC president. May will begin her term on June 7, 2022. Jolena Grande was re-appointed to serve another two-year term on the Board of Governors.

3. CCCCO Update (Candice Brooks/Sean Madden)

Leslie Le Blanc was introduced she is the Specialist at Chancellor's Office, temporarily assigned to the baccalaureate program

Le Blanc reported the following:

- Cycle 1 of baccalaureate degree program applications is under way;
- The CCCCO is hosting meetings with the applicants.
- The CCCCO legal team is reviewing a few areas of the legislation for clarification.
- Cycle 2 will be delayed—the revised timeline will be shared once it is finalized;
- Legal team looking at a few items within the legislation for clarification
- The CCCCO is still in the process of forming the BDP workgroup—they plan to meet once this spring;
- The CCCCO is presenting at the CIAC conference on April 29;
- The CCCCO is working with the colleges to develop written responses to address feedback regarding duplication of curriculum raised by the intersegmental council. The written responses are for CCCCO use only;
- Delegation of Baccalaureate Degree Program Approval will be on the BOG May 23, 2022 agenda for second reading and approval. The item would delegate authority to the Board President to approve Baccalaureate Degree Programs proposed by the community college districts on the recommendation of the Chancellor.




4. CCCCIO Update (Billie Jo Rice)

5. Articulation Update (Estella Narrie)

Elizabeth Ramirez shared the result of the Baccalaureate Degree General Education survey the AOs sent to the field.





AB 1705 and the proposed limitation on pre-transfer level associate degree applicable math courses. Cheryl Aschenbach confirmed the ASCCC is not in support of AB 1705 as it was written at that time because it removes college-level math for students. She encouraged BDP members to send advocacy letter for amendments to be made to AB 1705.

6. BDP Research Update (Hai Hoang)

Hai Hoang reported the deadline for the graduate survey is currently April 18. BDP members agreed the deadline should be extended one week. Members shared techniques to get more students to complete the surveys—gift cards or other incentives tend to increase response rates.

During the discussion there was a recommendation to develop a new role on the Board to lead a subcommittee for the new colleges. This would provide a separate meeting space to focus on the development and implementation needs of new programs.

Tina Recale reminded members to send nominations for Chair and Lead Researcher to Shelly Hess or Mike Slavich.

10. Other

Anthony Cordova, Bakersfield College, shared Kern Community College District and California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office are cohosting "Good Jobs with Equity: The Future Workforce." The event is a call to action to prioritize economic and social mobility for underrepresented and minoritized communities. They are requesting a BDP representative.
